Allen P. Sudbury "Suds" 90, of Palmyra, passed away on Monday, March 5, 2018 at M.S. Hershey Medical Center. He was the husband of Betty M. (Rittle) Sudbury, with whom he had celebrated 67 years in marriage.

Allen was born in Lebanon on December 15, 1927 to the late George A. and Beatrice E. (Rittle) Sudbury. Allen had been a 1946 graduate of Hershey Industrial School. He had retired from Hershey Foods Company in molding maintenance in 1991. He served with the US Navy from 1946 to 1948. Allen had been a member of the First E. C. Church in Palmyra. He was a member of the Annville American Legion, Lebanon County Model Airplane Flyers, Tuesday Seniors League, and Local # 464 Chocolate Workers Union. Allen enjoyed bowling and his greatest love was flying model airplanes and remote-controlled airplanes.

Surviving in addition to his wife are his children, Dolores and her husband Lester Price of Palmyra, Donald R. Sudbury and his wife Loretta of Cleona, 7 grandchildren, and 10 great grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his siblings, Charles H. Sudbury, Catherine Kreider, and Esther Walters.

Funeral services will be held on Saturday March 10, 2018 at 12PM from Kreamer Funeral Home and Crematory Inc., 618 E. Main Street, Annville. Interment will be in Grand View Memorial Park, Annville. There will be a viewing held from 10AM until 12PM at the funeral home.

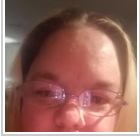

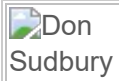
