Ammon A. Boltz, 66, of Cornwall died Friday, October 28, 2016 from injuries sustained in an automobile accident. He was the husband of Lisa M. Falana Boltz. Born in Lebanon on February 24, 1950, he was the son of the late Robert and Nancy Brouse Boltz. He started working in the car business in 1970 with the former R & J Motors, Lebanon and presently worked part-time for Bobby Gerhart's Truck World, Lebanon. Ammy, as he was known to his friends was a graduate of Valley Forge Military Academy and Lebanon Valley College. He was an active member of Hope Episcopal Church, Manheim where he served on the Vestry and Finance Committee. He was an avid golfer and enjoyed attending sporting events with family and friends.
