She was instrumental in the moving and renovating of the original railroad station in Annville. She had also received a plaque for voting for 50 years, never missing an election.

Blanche's greatest enjoyments in life came from her children and anything that involved caring for children, collecting antiques and restoring things, and flowers. Her garden was showcased on the local "Flower Tours" in Annville.
