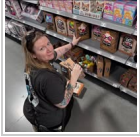

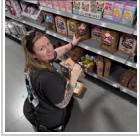

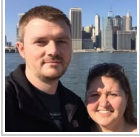
I never would have imagined that, so soon after our difficult breakup, we'd be faced with the even greater heartbreak of losing him.
