David M. Saylor, 63, of Harrisburg died Tuesday, June 13, 2017 the Lebanon VA Medical Center.

Born in Miami, Florida on March 16, 1954, he was the son of Dolores Jonovich Saylor of Lebanon and the late William D. Saylor. He worked as a supply officer for the Department of Defense, New Cumberland and as a supply officer for the Smithsonian Institute, Washington, D.C.
