Earl M. Kline, 90, of Lebanon, passed away on Saturday February 6, 2021 at his residence. He was the husband of Viola H. (Wike) Kline.

Earl was born in Myerstown on March 30, 1930 to the late Martin and Birtha Kline. He was a US Navy Veteran. He fought in the Korean Conflict and served on the USS Midway, aircraft carrier. He had worked for Bethlehem Steel as a welder and worked in security at The Hershey Community Theatre and Good Samaritan Hospital. He served on various church boards. Earl made it into the medical journals at Hershey Medical Center, for a process that has never been done and recovered from before. The doctors were able to re-attach his ear and have it grow back without any complications. They were then able to use Earl's experience to teach future doctors through their medical training. He was well known and loved by many.

Surviving in addition to his wife are his children, Richard Kline of Syracuse, NY, William Kline (Laurie), Gloria Kline, Michael Kline, and Harold Kline Jr., all of Lebanon, and several grandchildren and great grandchildren. He was predeceased by a son, Harold Kline, Sr., of Lebanon. He was one of 13 children, being preceded in death by all his siblings.
