Elbert H. "Elby" Myers, 87, of Fredericksburg, went home to heaven on Saturday, February 4, 2012, at his home, surrounded by his loving family. He was the husband of Kathryn C. Rentschler Myers, and on April 12th, they would have celebrated their 65th wedding anniversary. Born in Lebanon on August 7, 1924, he was the son of the late Geneva Hernley Myers. He was the owner and operator of Myers' Auto Sales in Fredericksburg, and retired in 1989. During WW II he served in the US Army in the Rhineland and the Battle of the Bulge.
