Ernest W. "Ernie" Heisey, 89, of Annville passed away on Sunday, June 25th, 2023, at Cedar Haven Healthcare Center. He was preceded in death by his loving wife, Betty Jane (Miller) Heisey.

Born in Annville, PA on April 5th, 1934, he was the son of the late Warren and Hilda (Lingle) Heisey.
