



Francis J. Dankulich Jr.

Francis J. "Frank" Dankulich, Jr., of Lebanon, passed away unexpectedly, on Tuesday, November 28, 2017, at his home. He was the husband of Virginia E. "Libby" Graham.

Born in Branchdale on October 26, 1948, he was the son of the late Francis J. Sr., and Lillian Keiser Dankulich. Frank retired from the Lebanon VA Medical Center after 32 years of service where he worked in maintenance for many years and was later appointed leader of wheelchair repair services. Following his retirement he opened Mobility One, LLC in Lebanon. For a number of years he ran with the Glenn Lebanon Volunteer Fire Co. and he was a lifetime member of the VFW. He served in the US Army. Frank loved racing and over the years he built and owned a number of street stock cars and raced them at various local tracks.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by his son Michael V. Dankulich of Jonestown; daughters Angela S. Dankulich and Kimberly S. Wolfe of Jonestown; step-son David A. Rhoads of Lebanon; step-daughter Lora L. wife of Daniel Moyer of Myerstown; sister Janice wife of Gary Kent of Branchdale; 6 grandchildren and several nieces and nephews.

A memorial service will be held on Thursday, December 7, 2017, at 12 noon at the Open Door Baptist Church, 875 Academy Drive, Lebanon, PA. There will be no viewing, but a visitation will be held beginning at 11:00 a.m. until the start of the service. Interment will follow at the Indiantown Gap National Cemetery.
