November 28, 1938 - June 26, 2013

Frank E. Wakefield, 74, of Lebanon died Wednesday June 26, 2013 in the Good Samaritan Hospital, Lebanon. He was the husband of Ann Montgomery Wakefield with whom he celebrated their 55th Wedding Anniversary this past June 17th. Born in Huntingdon on November 28, 1938, he was the son of the late Frank and Viola Worthy Wakefield. He retired after 43 years of service as a produce manager at Weis Markets, Lebanon. Frank was a 1957 graduate of Captain Jack High School and served seven years in the PA Army National Guard. He was a member of Hill United Church of Christ where he served as Deacon from 2003-2010 and Elder in 2013, Mt. Association, and the Travelers Protective Association of America. Surviving in addition to his wife is a son Brian Wakefield at home, a daughter Brenda wife of Wally Leader of Hummelstown, granddaughter Alex Leader of Hummelstown, sister Marlene wife of Bill Hancock of Mt. Union, a brother Dennis Wakefield, and two canine buddies who gave him their unconditional love-Mac and Darcy.
