Gail M. Zearfoss, 77, of Lebanon, passed away on Monday, April 4, 2022, at her home. She was the wife of Charles M. Zearfoss. On May 2nd, they would have celebrated their 58th wedding anniversary.

Born in Miami Beach, FL on August 29, 1944, she was the daughter of the late James and Helen Cole Murphy. Gail had worked at Indiantown Gap. She retired from the Lebanon VA Medical Center, where she had worked as an operator. She was a member of St. Cecilia's Catholic Church, Lebanon.
