George Wendell Bryce, Jr., 66, of 3925 Hill Church Road, Lebanon died Thursday February 23, 2012 in his residence. He was the husband of Carolyn A. Tyger Bryce. Born at the Banana River Navel Base Air Station, Cocoa Beach, FL on March 16, 1945, he was the son of Mary Grace Light Bryce of Lebanon and the late George W.
