George R. "Smitty" Smith, 75, of Fredericksburg, and formerly of Buckingham, passed away on Sunday, September 18, 2011, at his home. He was the husband of Midge Jamison Smith and on June 18th, they celebrated their 51st wedding anniversary. Born in Philadelphia, on December 23, 1935, he was the son of the late George A. and Sarah H. Redstreak Smith.
