I already knew she wanted to be able to do what she loved to do through the years, share with her family and her family wasn't just her children or other relatives. To her, her family was whoever she cared about or showed up at her home. We will greatly miss hearing her gracious, caring words with that beautiful strong accent, her loving heart, beautiful smile, and her gentle hugs. An icon of our church family has gone home.
