Gerald R. "Jiggs" Wengert, 82, of 147 S. Cherry Street, Annville died Monday May 27, 2013 in the M. S. Hershey Medical Center. Born in McGillstown, PA on January 7, 1931, he was the son of the late Allen H. and Edna L. Blouch Wengert. He served as a patrolman for 14 years before being named Chief of Police of the Annville Twp. Police Department and serving in that capacity for 13 years before retiring in 1992. He then worked part-time as a Deputy Sheriff for Lebanon County. He was a member of Annville United Methodist Church, FOP Lodge #42, Lebanon County, PA Deputy Sheriff's Association, NRA, Citizens Committee for the Right to Keep an Bare Arms, Second Amendment Foundation, Bellview, Washington, Law Enforcement Alliance of America, and the Weavertown Gunning Club.
