Glenn E. "Alex" Alexander, 68, of Jonestown, passed away on Sunday, October 16, 2016, at the Lebanon VA Medical Center. He was the husband of Lynn E. (Leibig) Alexander, with whom he celebrated 8 years in marriage. He was born in Sayre, PA on March 28, 1948, to the late Wayland and Louise Campbell Alexander. Alex had attended Milton Hershey School, and Physician's Assistant School at Penn State Hershey. He retired as a physician's assistant from the VA Medical Center in Coatesville. Alex was a veteran of the US Air Force, having served in Vietnam as a medic. He was a Life Member of Milton Hershey School Alumni Association, VFW in Keene, NH, and Vietnam Veterans of America. He was also a member of VFW Hershey Memorial Post 3502. Alex enjoyed playing golf and history, especially the Civil War.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by his daughter Dawna Alexander of Grantville; step-sons Stephen Wolfe of Georgia and Christian Wolfe of Germany; grandchildren Cameron Wolfe, Zachery Wolfe & Vanessa Wolfe; brothers Ronald Alexander of Hershey, Wayland Alexander of Johnson City, NY, & James Alexander of Lockwood, NY; and sisters Carol Alexander of Lockwood, NY & Mary Mosier of Waverly, NY.
