In accordance with Glenn's wishes there will be no services.

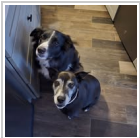

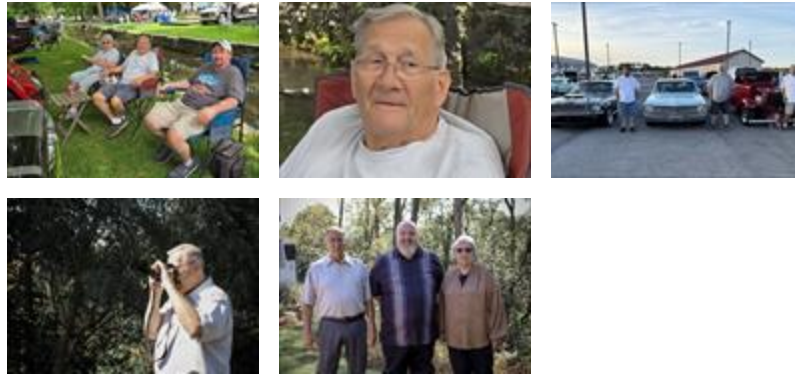
