Harold H. "Bud" Killinger, 88, of 238 W. Queen Street, Annville entered into union with his Lord and Savior Jesus Christ on Saturday July 27, 2013 in the M. S. Hershey Medical Center.

He was the husband of Florence M. "Floss" Sweigert Killinger with whom he celebrated their 56th Wedding Anniversary this past June 1st. Born in Annville on June 1, 1925, he was the son of the late Harold R. and Elizabeth Paine Killinger. He was retired from the longitude department at Hershey Foods Corporation and also worked part time for the Hershey Trust Company. Bud was a US Army Veteran of WW II serving with Company K, 83rd Infantry Division and fought in the Battle of the Bulge.

He was a 1943 graduate of Annville High School, a member of Christ Church United Church of Christ, Annville American Legion, AARP, DAV, and the Veterans of the Battle of the Bulge. He was known as "Mr. Hershey Park" and enjoyed riding Hershey Park roller coasters. He loved his grandchildren, traveling, and catered to people with a servant's heart. One of the greatest and most rewarding parts of his life was the special role he played in the lives

of his granddaughters, Michelle and Melissa.
