



## Harold A. Reist

July 15, 1929 - November 5, 2022

Harold A. Reist, age 93, went home to be with the Lord on November 5th at the Lebanon Valley Home, Annville, PA.

He was born in Jackson Township, Lebanon County on July 15, 1929, to the late Mays and Alma Marks Reist. He was preceded in death by his wife, Janet, on December 30, 2011. He is survived by his daughter, Marilyn L., wife of Ronald W.
