



## Hermann L. Boldt

February 12, 1929 - October 3, 2017

Hermann L. Boldt, 88, of Myerstown, passed away on Tuesday, October 3, 2017, at the VA Medical Center. He was the husband of the late Ellen L. Boldt. Born in Torrington, CT on February 12, 1929, he was the son of the late Hermann and Elsa Godicke Boldt. Hermann retired as a CW 4 from the U.S. Army. He served during the Korean and Vietnam Conflicts and was a U.S. Ranger and a Missile Officer. Following his retirement, he had worked as a Service Manager with VW in Brunswick, ME and then sold insurance for Met-Life. Herman was a 70 year member of the First Congregational Church in Torrington, CT and attended the Indiantown Gap Chapel for 30 years. He was a life member of the American Legion Post 910, the Korean War Veteran and Ranger Association and a member of the Keystone Chapter of the Assoc. of the U.S. Army. Along with his wife, he was active in the organizing of Airborne Army Ranger Reunion. Remembering his Army Ranger days, he loved to jump. In June of last year, he was proud to make his last jump at 87 years of age. He loved God, his beloved wife, his children, the Army and his country. He is survived by his sons John and his wife Carol Boldt of Auburn, ME and Joe and his wife Kim Boldt of Myerstown; daughter Connie Ellen Boldt of Norfolk, VA; grandchildren Jason, Shannon, Ryan and Joseph and 8 great grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his brother Henry Boldt.
