James W. Dial, 71, of 250 Crooked Lane, Lebanon went home to be with the Lord on Friday, December 14, 2012 while in the Good Samaritan Hospital, Lebanon. Jim and his wife, Lois G. (Marks) Dial, had celebrated their 50th Wedding Anniversary in September. Born in Columbia, KY on August 6, 1941, he was the son of the late Walter and Della (Compton) Dial. Jim and his wife had worked in the construction industry throughout their lives together, but had been more recently specializing in telecommunications and fiber optic construction for the last 22 years with Jamesway Construction, Inc. Jim was a US Army veteran and had served in Korea after graduating from Adair County High School, Columbia, KY, in 1959. His passion for flying, flight instruction and the military led to active involvement and the promotion to Major in the Civil Air Patrol. He was a member of the Lebanon VFW Post 23, Mt. Lebanon Lodge #226 and the Lebanon American Legion. His many friendships and social nature had also earned him the title of "Honorary Filipino" in Lebanon County.
