James Joseph "J" Dwyer, 75, of 704 3rd Street, Mt. Gretna, died Friday March 18, 2011 in Hospice of Lancaster County, Mt. Joy. He was the husband of Constance Ehrhart Dwyer to whom he was married for 14 years. Born in Akron, Ohio on November 24, 1935, he was the son of the late James Joseph, Jr. and Ruth Gustely Dwyer. Jim grew up in Hudson, Ohio and graduated from Western Reserve Academy, Hudson, OH and the University of Rochester, Rochester, New York. His career started in retail, managing stores for W.T. Jim was an avid golfer, and a Cleveland Browns and Ohio State football and basketball fan. He enjoyed traveling and music, particularly jazz, and a good book, a good beer, and a good story. Jim maintained a curious and determined spirit throughout his entire life. Surviving in addition to his wife are four children: Anne E. Dwyer of Roanoke, TX; James J. husband of Staci Dwyer of Keller, TX; Greg M. Dwyer and Fianceé Janelle Mancuso of Hyattsville, MD; and Nancy C., wife of Wendel Martincovic of Lake Panasoffkee, Fla.; and two grandchildren, Nicholas and Zacary Dwyer. At his
