“ I spoke with Jordan nearly every day for about 5 years. He was one of my best friends, and one of the best people I've ever met. He would often mix me and another close friend of ours up and he teased all of us relentless. I would give anything to hear him make fun of me for being short again. He taught me a lot about what a real friend is, and the difference between friendly bullying and malicious bullying.



He also gave me some of the best times of my life. The last phone call we had, I can't even remember what we were doing- but I remember that we were both laughing when we hung up. If I was ever down, I could count on him to make me laugh, or if I was playing a game that scared me too much, I knew he would join if he could.

If there's one thing that I regret about our friendship, it's not telling how much I loved him often enough. He was one of the best human beings in the world, and I don't think I made that as clear to him as I could have. It's cliché, and he would tease the hell out of me if I said that to him, but it's the truth.

To all of his family- his mother, his father, anybody else that's read this far- his online and long distance friends are also grieving. We only found out because of his obituary. From our perspective, he was missing for nearly a week before we found out. I want it to be so, so clear that he was incredibly loved, by all of us, and we are mourning him, too.
