Kenneth A. Binkley, 76, of Annville, passed away at the Good Samaritan Hospital on Saturday, June 16, 2018.

Born in Lebanon on March 5, 1942, he was the son of the late Allen R. and Thelma (Smith) Binkley. Kenneth worked as a Fire Chief for the Harrisburg International Airport and the Fort Indiantown Gap Fire Department as the Fire Chief until his retirement.
