Lawrence F. Mann, 70, of Pine Grove passed away Monday, June 6, 2016, at the Penn State Hershey Medical Center. His wife Susan A. Barr was by his side as they celebrated their 28th wedding anniversary on the same day of his passing.

Born in Brooklyn, on November 7, 1945, he was the son of Jane (Richter) Mann Smart of Naples, FL. and the late Edward H. Mann. He graduated from Stamford High School, Stamford, Ct. in 1963. Larry served as a Navy Corpsman from 1965 to 1969 during the Vietnam War. In 1972 he received an Associate's Degree in Science from York College as well as graduating from St. Joseph Hospital school of Respiratory Therapy in Lancaster.
