Lemoyne S. Reigle, 98, of Cleona, passed away on Tuesday, November 25, 2025, at Linden Village, Lebanon. He was the husband of the late Irene (Douple) Reigle, who died in 1972, Doris (Smith) Reigle, who died in 1989, and Dorothy (Douple) Reigle who died in 2002.
