Margaret Bomberger passed away on January 29, 2021, age 96, was born February 15, 1924 to the late Rosie (Kreiser) Davis and Harry Davis. She was preceded in death by her husband Mark S. Bomberger in June 2006 after 57 ½ years, and her first husband John J. Stickler who was fatally injured in the Cornwall Ore Mine, July 26, 1946 – 10 months to the day after discharge from the Air Force, leaving her with an 18-day old son. Both men were WWII Veterans.

She graduated from Annville High School in 1941. As her sons grew up, she was employed at Annville Shoulder Strap, from where she retired. She was an avid gardener, sharing with many.

Stickler who died in an auto accident at age 20. She had three brothers and five sisters she was the last sibling of the family. She is survived by many nieces and nephews.
