Having retired in 2002 after thirty-three years as a high school English teacher, I remember Mrs. Albert as my ninth grade (and perhaps eighth grade) English teacher at Cornwall High School circa 1959-60. I have a fuzzy recollection that she may have been pregnant with John during those years. She required us to memorize poems and Shakespearean passages, which I can still stumble through. When I became a teacher, I taught the grammar I learned from her and her colleagues and implemented some of her teaching strategies in my own classroom. And when I inspected textbooks before collecting them from students at the end of the year, I thought of Mrs. Albert when I looked for those bent page corners that she taught us were called dog ears. Yes, today's fond recollections of Mrs. Albert serve as a reminder of the indelible memories that students potentially have of teachers some 60-plus years later.
