Michael B. Miller, 71, of Palmyra died Sunday, August 5, 2018 suddenly in his residence.

Born in Elkhart, Indiana on August 9, 1946, he was the son of the late Henry W. and Lois J. Stump Miller. He was a retired teacher/principal with the Northern Lebanon School District with 30 years of service.

Mike was a 1964 graduate of Annville-Cleona High School, received his master's degree from Shippensburg University, and his principal's certificate from Lehigh University.

He was a member of Mountville United Methodist Church where he served as superintendent of the Sunday School, Annville-Cleona Kiwanis Club, PA Association of School Retirees, PA School Employees Retirement System, social member of the Annville American Legion, Lebanon County Historical Society, a board member of Wenger Cemetery since 1971, and a volunteer at the Lebanon Valley Home and Countryside Christian Community. He also enjoyed traveling to Germany.

Surviving are two sisters Barbara J. wife of William Colver, Cynthia R. wife of Philip Engle both of Annville, 8 nieces and nephews and 9 great nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by a sister Sara E. Nissley DeJesus.

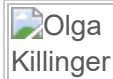
