Norman Rex Benson, 71, of Lebanon died Wednesday October 6, 2010 in the Good Samaritan Hospital, Lebanon. He was the husband of J. Elaine Lowderman Benson to whom he was married for 50 years. Born in Independence, MO on March 25, 1939 he was the son of the late Tom and Beulah Rex Benson. Norm was a 1957 graduate of Van Horn High School Independence, MO and a 1963 graduate from the University of Kansas with a degree in business. He served his country as a cold war veteran in the United States Air Force. After 30 years as a District Mgr, with South Western Bell, Norm became an avid astronomer. His children teased him and asked for individual horoscopes. He was a past president of the Dallas chapter, Texas Astronomical Society and a former member of the Kiwanis Club of Dallas, TX. In addition to his wife he is survived by two sons; Dr. Steve Benson and wife Jean (Betty) of Ashland, MA and Lt Col Scott Benson and wife Raneé of Acworth, GA; one daughter Stacy Benson of Palmyra; five grandchildren Nikolas, Sophia, Mitchell, Matthew and Joseph Benson. Norm was preceded in death by a grandson Gabriel Benson. Memorial services will be held on Monday, 12:00PM at the Creamer Funeral Home and Crematory 618 E. Main St. Annville. Inurnment will be held at the convenience of the family. A visitation will be held one hour prior to the service from 11:00AM-12:00PM at the funeral home. There will be no viewing.
