Palm C. Bernardo, 92, of Ponte Vedra, FL passed away on Wednesday, October 15, 2025, at Starling of Ponte Vedra (Assisted Living Community). She was the wife of the late Edward F. Bernardo, who passed away in 2020. Palm was born in Lebanon on April 9, 1933, to the late Domenico and Vienna (Baldori) Candori. She was a 1950 graduate of Annville High School. She began working as a teller at Farmer's Trust Bank, and eventually became a Vice President of Farmer's Trust Bank, which later became Fulton Bank. She received the Athena Award in 1995, which recognizes women who achieve professional excellence and strive to improve the quality of life for others in the community.
