Peter P. Miele, 80, passed away on Friday, March 9, 2012, at the Lebanon Good Samaritan Hospital, surrounded by his children and friends. He was the husband of the late Colleen J. Francis Miele. Born in Mt. Pleasant, on June 26, 1931, he was the son of the late John and Catherine Perillo Miele. He retired as a MSgt. from the PA Army National Guard, where he had served for over 39 years.
