Richard J. "Dick" Bell, Jr., passed on to his eternal home surrounded by family on Sunday, October 31, 2021. politics, his family or telling a joke. Dick also enjoyed hunting, fishing, and carving. Pappy's favorite activity was his love of trout fishing. He was excited to take all his great grandkids out for a day at the lake or stream.
