Ronald M. Miller, 79, of Lebanon, went to be with his Lord and Savior on Monday, May 11, 2026, at WellSpan Good Samaritan Hospital, Lebanon. He was the husband of the late Joan M. (Sechrist) Miller.

Born in Lebanon on October 29, 1946, he was the son of the late Ernest and Marian (Bomberger) Miller. Ron retired from Alcoa where he started out in maintenance and worked his way up to Labor Relations. He was very active in their fire safety program.
