Samuel L. Daub, 71, of Jonestown, walked into the arms of Jesus on Saturday, August 12, 2017, at his home, after a 10 year battle with ALS. He was the husband of Shirley A. Blouch Daub. On July 4th, they celebrated their 53rd wedding anniversary.

Born in Lebanon on March 14, 1946, he was the son of the late Ray M. and Gladys A. Bender Daub. Sam retired from Peirce Welding in Bethel. He was a member of the Living Waters Chapel. He loved to sing and for many years he sang bass in the Minutemen Quartet, with the Centurions and also with the Kintzel Brothers.

“ I'd like to take a moment and share a few memories I had with my once father-in-law

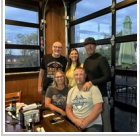
