Shirley M. Wickham, 83, of Lebanon died Tuesday, October 2, 2012, at home, surrounded by her loving family. She was the wife of Robert L. Wickham, to whom she was married for 62 years. Born in Canandaigua, N.Y., on Aug. 15, 1929, she was the daughter of Hubert H. Sr. and Marie Miller Willer. Shirley was a 1945 graduate of Canandaigua Academy and received her bachelor's degree from Westhampton College, University of Richmond (Va.) in 1949. She later earned her master's degree in guidance from the State University of New York, Albany. She was a veteran educator, teaching middle school in Beacon, N.Y., and in Lake City, Fla. She later was employed as a guidance counselor at St. Mary's Academy in Alexandria, Va. Mrs. Wickham was a communicant of St. Paul the Apostle Church, Annville. She enjoyed collecting unique antiques, reading newspapers and discussing politics, and was a lifelong, devout New York Yankees fan. Surviving in addition to her husband are two daughters and sons-in-law, Kelley and Timothy Wickham-Crowley of Fairfax, Va.; and Shawne Wickham and Ric Waldman of Hopkinton, N.H.; a brother, Hubert H. Willer, Jr. of Vancouver, Wa.; and a grandson, Bryn Waldwick of Boston, Mass. A Mass of Christian Burial will be celebrated on Thursday at 9 a.m. from St. Paul the Apostle Church, 125 S. Spruce St., Annville. Interment will follow in Indiantown Gap National Cemetery, E. Hanover Township, Pa. There will be no viewing or visitation.
