William H. "Bill" Girvin, 73, of Fredericksburg, passed away on Saturday September 5, 2009 in the Hospice Unit of the Lebanon VA Medical Center. He was the husband of Elizabeth Audrey nee Hoffman Girvin with whom he celebrated his 51st wedding anniversary on July 19, 2009 He was born on January 2, 1936 in Pittsburgh, PA son of the late Patrick and Anne (nee) Wansick Girvin. He was the youngest of 10 children.
